IEM is one of the most unique study abroad you could attend at Michigan State University. This service learning abroad provides a powerful combination of the classroom instruction, international volunteer work and facilitated group discussions. IEM is designed to guide students into a better understanding of core concepts through action.

IEM begins with a series of class meetings that cover topics ranging from Mexican-American history to service-learning and civic engagement. During the spring break vacation, the class of over one hundred students gets divided into five cities in Mexico where they are able to apply the concepts they have learned in the classroom.


