OUR PURPOSE

The ID&R Center are a grantee of the Michigan Department of Education's, Migrant Education Program (MiMEP) responsible for finding any eligible migrant children in the state of Michigan. We work closely with the migrant and seasonal farmworkers community, service agencies, schools and other organizations that support workers and their families.

The objective of the Statewide Identification and Recruitment Program is to make certain that all eligible migratory children and youth in Michigan (even those in remote areas) are identified and connected to the education system. Our ultimate goal is to assist migrant students in obtaining of either a high school diploma or GED by connecting them with educational supports and assisting with basic needs.

63 counties in the thumb, east, southeast, and northern areas of the state are covered by the MSU Identification and Recruitment (ID&R) Center.

We work together with migrant education programs across the country to ensure students stay enrolled and supported. To be eligible for the program children must have traveled with a farmworker in the past 3 years.
